THE LATE MRS. E. SMITH

Mrs. **Emma SMITH**, of 10 Denness-road, who died on Wednesday of last week, was an indefatigable worker for Dr. Barnardo's Homes and had been honoured for her efforts by that organisation. She was a daughter of the late Charles SHEPPARD who was a well known tradesman in Ryde. After his death she helped her mother to run a boarding house, but on her marriage in 1914 to Mr. W. SMITH, a General Post Office official, went to live at Leigh, Lancashire, returning to the Island after her husband's death. Mrs. SMITH, who was 71, had lived here for about two years. She leaves two brothers, one of whom lives in Mexico and the other in Natal.
