MRS. A. HARVEY

After three years of suffering, Mrs. **Alice HARVEY**, wife of Mr. George Robert HARVEY, of 38 Hill-street, Ryde, died on Thursday.

Mrs. HARVEY, who was aged 62, was born in Binstead and married in 1906. After living in Ryde for fifteen years she and her husband left the Island and for some years moved from one place to another, Mr. HARVEY being a Post Office worker.

Last July they returned to Ryde and later Mrs. HARVEY was taken to the Vectis Nursing Home.

Of the three children, two daughters are left, the son having died in Ryde at the age of 17.

The funeral was at All Saints' Church and Ryde Cemetery, on Monday.
