FUNERAL

Much sympathy was aroused in connection with the death of **Harold Emmanuel BEVIS**, whose funeral took place on Saturday afternoon, last aged 26. He was 17 when he enlisted at Cowes in the Rifles Brigade. He served in France and was wounded and gassed, being discharged on June 25th 1918, when he was 20. He has been most carefully nursed since by his mother and was often to be seen out in an invalid chair. A service was held at Hoy Trinity Church, conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. Noel H. STUBBS) who also performed the committal at the Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. BEVIS (father and mother), Mr. T. BEVIS and Mr. Jim BEVIS (brothers), Mrs. W.
