DEATH OF MR. H. PAUL

The death took place at the Jubilee Garage, 42 Park-road, on Monday, of Mr. **Harry PAUL**, who for very many years has been a well-known figure in the buriness life of the town. Mr. PAUL passed away at the age of 78, after an illness lasting over three months. Early in life the deceased started business on his own account as a haulage contractor and Posting Master, and prior to the introduction of a steam roller held a contract to provide a team of horses for pulling the old-fashioned road roller in the town. He also provided brakes and waggonettes which, with the old four-in-hand coaches were familiar vehicles in use by visitors touring the Island over two decades ago. When mechanical transport superseded the horse-drawn vehicles deceased's shrewd business ability, despite his great love of horses,, led him to keep abreast of the times, and charabancs and motor-vans were adopted. He was a great lover of animals and for man years was tenant of Beaper Farm on the Brading-road, which he carried on with much success. The funeral took place on Thursday, the first portion of the service being held in the Wesleyan Church, where the Rev. W. SEED officiated. The mourners were Mr. Harry PAUL (son), Mrs. HERBERT (daughter), Mrs. H. PAUL (daughter-in-law), Mr. Lloyd PAUL (grandson), Mrs. MILLARD and Miss PAUL (nieces), Mr. J. PAUL (nephew), Mrs. PAUL (sister-in-law), Mr. H. J. JOLLIFFE, and Messrs. E. LIFE and W. TANSOM (old employees). Among others at the church were Messrs. G. FARDELL, W. R. TAYLOR, J.P., E. WARD, A. YOUNG, J. H. DOWN, F. PLATER, F. and W. READ, W. RUSSELL, P. LANGDON (representing the owners of Beaper Farm), C. W. SALTER, F. PECK, and W. GOUGH. The interment was at the cemetery and the coffin was covered with many floral tokens. Mr. C. LANGDON was the undertaker.
