A service at All Saints' Church on Monday preceded the interment in Ryde Cemetery of Mr. Reginald John Scott JACKSON, aged 49, of Fleet, Hampshire, who died at the Royal Marsden Hospital, Sutton, on January 6<sup>th</sup>. Canon R. GRANGER officiated. Mr. JACKSON was born in the town, where he will be remembered as a keen sportsman. Prior to the war he played football for Ryde Rovers and Cricket for Ashey and Brading. Later he played cricket for Ryde and the Royal Aircraft Establishment Club and served as vice-president of the Ryde and Fleet cricket clubs and the R.A.E. Amateur Dramatic Society. During the last war he served both at home and abroad and gained promotion to the rank of Lieutenant in the R.N.V.R. He married Miss Brenda DANIELL in 1952, and they resided in Farnborough and later at Fleet. He worked in the Air Ministry, the Ministry of Aircraft Production and the Ministry of Supply, and his last appointment was as assistant director in the Ministry of Technology. He attended the R.A.F. Staff College, Bracknell, in 1955. The mourners were Mrs. JACKSON (widow), Lieut.-Commander and Mrs. R. M. S. JACKSON (brother and sister-in-law). Other relatives present were Mr. R. F. S.
