## FORMER MAYORESS

There was a large congregation at All Saints' Parish Church on Monday for the funeral of Mrs. Amy May ROGERS, of 6 Barfield, who died on Thursday. Born in Newport, Mrs. ROGERS was the widow of a former Island police chief, Superintendent Harry ROGERS, who was Mayor in Ryde from 1956-58. They lived in various parts of the Island, but for most of the time in Ryde. Mr. ROGERS died about four years ago. An active member of the Parish Church, Mrs. ROGERS also belonged to the Mothers' Union, the Red Cross (where she helped with the club for the disabled), the Afternoon Townswomen's Guild, and the British Legion. She took a keen interest in music and drama events. Her husband, a horticultural enthusiast, was an organiser and exhibitor at the Borough of Ryde Show, and after his death Mrs. ROGERS carried on the tradition, taking many prizes. The Vicar, Canon Ronald GRANGER, officiated and the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm to "Crimond" and "Rock of Ages" were sung. Representatives included those from Ryde Borough Council, including the Mayor and Mayoress, Cllr. And Mrs. Harold MOREY, and the Town Clerk Mr. Edwin SHEPPARD, All Saints' Mothers' Union, the Afternoon Townswomen's Guild, Red Cross, British Legion and the Post Office. Family mourners included Mr. and Mrs. O. T. SAUNDERS, Mr. and Mrs. G. A. MILLS, daughters and sons-in-law; Mrs. DAMP, also representing Mr. C. DAMP who was indisposed, and Mr. and Mrs. SHEPHERD, sisters and brothers-in-law; Mr. F. COLLEDGE, brother-in-law; Mr. G. COLLEDGE, nephew. Many friends and neighbours also attended.
