DEATH OF MR. JAMES LAVARS –

The death occurred at his residence, Le Blanc House, the Strand, on Sunday, of Mr. James William LAVARS. The deceased had not enjoyed robust health for a considerable period and was seriously ill for some three weeks prior to his passing. He was 82 years of age and had resided here for many years, during which time he evinced a keen interest in local affairs, although he was not actively associated with any public body. He was one of the oldest members of the local lodge of Oddfellows and was greatly respected. The Rev. A.C.DURHAM conducted the funeral at the Cemetery on Tuesday.
