INQUEST ON RYDE WOMAN ADJOURNED

The inquest on Mrs. **Mary Doris DYE**, 43, of 15 Castle-street, Ryde who died at St. Mary's Hospital, Newport, on Friday, was adjourned by the Island Coroner, Mr. John BULLIN, at Newport on Tuesday until October 23.

Mr. BULLIN heard only evidence of identification from her husband, Mr. Ronald Victor DYE, before the adjournment.

Mrs. DYE came to Ryde in 1945 from Burnley. During the war she worked in the N.A.A.F.I. at Wolverhampton. She was well known in connection with her husband's shoe repair shop in Castle-street, and leaves two sons.

A service at the Ryde Cemetery Chapel yesterday afternoon preceded interment at the cemetery. Principal family mourners included: Mr. R. V. DYE, husband; Mr. D. DYE and Mr. C. DYE, sons; and Mr. and Mrs. A. WATERWORTH, parents.
