DEATH OF MRS. LAMBRICK -

Mrs. Rosa Matilda LAMBRICK, of Ryde, whose death occurred on Friday week, aged 79 years, was a member of a well known Island seafaring family. Her maiden name was GAWN, her father being coxwain of the lifeboat Selina so named after her mother. Her second husband was a kinsman of Gen. George LAMBRICK, Royal Marine Light Infantry, who was made aide de camp to Queen Victoria when she was in residence at Osborne House. Mrs. LAMBRICK was also related to Commodore B.C.S.MARTIN, RN., who was captain of H.M.S. Dorsetshire at the sinking of the German battleship Bismarck.
