DEATH OF MR. JOHN KNAPTON –

Mr. John KNAPTON of 7 Green-street, Ryde, passed away at the Royal I.W. County Hospital on Sunday, October 6th at the age of 64 years. Deceased, who was a native of Ryde, was extremely well-known and highly respected. He had carried on a business of a dairy farmer at Green Lane Farm, Asheys, for many years, succeeding his father to that holding. He retired from the business some few years ago. The funeral service will take place at All Saints Church at two o'clock on Thursday, and the arrangements are in the hands of Mr. Harry V. TAYLOR of 42 Green-street.

DEATH OF MR. J. KNAPTON –

The death occurred on Sunday at the County Hospital of **Mr. John David Jacob KNAPTON**, of 7 Green-street. Deceased had been ill for about a year. He was a native of Ryde, and was 64 years of age. For many years he lived at Green Lane Farm, Asheys, where he succeeded his father. He gave this up in 1916 and had since been working for Mr. CALLAWAY at Little Whitefield.
