### **MRS. JEMIMA WICKENS DIES AT RYDE**

A well known Ryde resident, Mrs. **Jemima WICKENS** died on Friday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. F. E. HELLYER, "Bermudiana", East Hill-road. She was 83 and had lived with her daughter for six months, formerly residing at Southlands.

A native of Haylands Mrs. WICKENS was one of the first members of Ryde British Legion Women's Section and was also a member of the W.V.S., Darby and Joan Club and Holy Trinity Mothers' Union. Her late husband died 40 years ago and she leaves 10 children – five sons and five daughters.
