DEATH OF MR. JOSEPH BEENEY.

Mr. **Joseph BEENEY**, of 3 Bank-place, died on Friday week at his home after several months of illness, at the age of 69. A native of Hastings, Mr. BEENEY lived for many years at Tunbridge Wells, where he played football for the Tunbridge Wells Rangers. He came to the Island 24 years ago and set up a secondhand dealers business in the High-street 17 years ago. A popular member of the community, he was also a well-known character at local auctions and a prominent figure in the Social Club of which he was a committee member and sports secretary. Mr. BEENEY served in the army during the first world war and was awarded the Military Medal at Vimy Ridge and made a King's Corporal. The funeral took place on Monday at the Parish Church when the Rev H. N. WILDE, M.B.E., M.C., officiated. The mourners were Mrs. E. BEENEY (widow), Messrs. W. P., C. P., and S. BEENEY (sons), Mr. and Mrs. P. HAILSTONE and Mr. and Mrs. STREETER (sons-in-law and daughters), Miss M. C. BEENEY, Mrs. L. STEPHENS, and Mrs. M. A. WHITEHORN (daughters), Mr. and Mrs. W., Mr. and Mrs. A., and Mr. and Mrs. S. BEENEY (brothers and sisters-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. J. DUNCAN (brother-in-law and sister), Mr. J. BALL (cousin), Messrs. S. and R. BEENEY (nephews), and Mrs. R. BEENEY, Mrs. G. KELVIE, Miss I. URRY, and Mr. T. SHAW. Many friends including Mr. G. DODSON (president) and Mr. G. W. RAWLINSON (secretary) and representatives of the Social Club, and those of Messrs. Wallis RIDDETT and Co. attended the service and there were nearly 50 floral tributes. The interment took place at Ryde Cemetery. Messrs. J. WHEELER and Sons were the undertakers.
