**MR. FRANK WRIGHT.
DEATH OF A TRADESMAN.**

We regret to record the death of one of the oldest local tradesmen, Mr. **FRANK WRIGHT**, a master baker and confectioner of Star Street corner, High Street, who passed peacefully away on Thursday the 13th, aged 69, The deceased worked with his father as a lad, and had been in the business for over 50years. His health had been indifferent for the last two years and he took little part in the trade during that period. His loss is deeply mourned and sympathy is felt for the widow and family of four in their bereavement. He was a past president of the I.W. Master Bakers' Association, and a member of the Conservative and Unionist Club. He was also a sidesman at All Saints for a good many years and on the committee of the Y.M.C.A.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon when the interment was preceded by a service at All Saints Church which was largely attended by sympathising friends. The mourners comprised Mrs. F.WRIGHT (widow), Mr. A. WRIGHT and Mr. W.H.WRIGHT (sons), the Misses A. and L. WRIGHT (daughters), Miss E. WRIGHT (sister), Mr. PARSONS and Mr. BRAY of London (nephews), Ald.G.E.MEARS, J.P., C.C. (brother in law), H. SWEETMAN Esq., J.P., Mrs. SIMMONDS (Yarbridge), Mr. J. RIDDICK (Bembridge). Mr.H. RIDDICK (Brading), and Mr. W. KING. There were also present the Mayor (Ald. A.ANDREWS J.P., C.C.) the Misses JELLICOE, Mrs. MEARS, Mrs. DE LAUNAY, Ald. J. B. PURNELL, Ald. W.E. WEEKS, Mr. A HOLMES, J.P., Councillors C.J.DE LAUNAY, W. DORE, and E.C. LOADER, Capt. VINCENT, Messrs. Arthur WOODS, F.W. MUNT, MELLISH, A. PAGE, and others. The vicar (the Rev. Hugh LE FLEMING) officiated. and the hymn "Let saints on earth in concert sing" was sung during the service.
