**SAILOR'S SUDDEN DEATH
MR FREDERICK BRADING**

The death took place suddenly at the end of last week, at the home of his parents in Arthur-street, of Mr **Frederick Walter BRADING**, aged 25, a leading seaman who had been invalided from the Royal Navy after 10 year's service, he having served on board H.M.S. Doris during the late war and obtained the medal and bar for that campaign. The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery on Tuesday, when the coffin, covered with the Union Jack with the floral harp, was carried to the grave by six of the deceased's comrades, and a large company of men from H. M. S. Enchantress, on which deceased last served, followed, in charge of a chief petty officer. Floral tributes were sent by his old shipmates, and friends in the town, in addition to relatives and others. There was a large general attendance at the impressive service, which was touchingly conducted by the Rev. A. DEDAMESS.
