DEATH OF MR. JAMES ELEY

It is with deep regret that we announce the death of Mr. **James ELEY**, of 22 Well-street, Ryde, which occurred on Saturday, after but a week's illness, at the advanced age of 85. The funeral took place on Tuesday, the first part of the service being held at the house, conducted by the Rev. G. AVERY, of Sutton. The chief mourners were, Mr. James ELEY (son), Messrs. R. GREGORY, H. MEADER, and MALEKIN (sons-in-law), Messrs. Richard and George COLNUTT (cousins). Assembled at the cemetery were several of the older tradesmen who were contemporary with Mr. ELEY in town activities. There was a large number of floral tributes. The late Mr. ELEY had resided in the town for 57 years, for 43 of which he carried on a business in Union-street. He was the first secretary of the Ryde Association, and was also secretary of the Sports and Amusements Club. Taking a deep interest in the prosperity and popularity of the town he worked strenuously for many years in various ways to advance its interests. It is worthy to note that for 53 years the family had been an unbroken one, but three deaths have now occurred within eight months, first Mrs. ELEY, then a son – William Campling ELEY, a prisoner of War in Germany – and now the father. Much sympathy is felt with the bereaved relatives.
