DEATH OF A WELL KNOWN JOURNALIST.

We regret to record the death of Mr. **Ebenezer HARTNALL**, one of the oldest and best known journalists in the Isle of Wight. The deceased, who had been in failing health for some time, received a shock from which he never recovered by the adverse verdict in the recent action for libel, brought against him by Mr. V.A. WEBBER. Other proceedings which followed were connected with the action intensified his anxieties. His enfeebled constitution became powerless to resist an ordinary malady which usually yields to simple treatment; he sank into a semi unconscious state, in which he remained for several days; and died early on Thursday morning. Mr. HARTNALL started business here as a printer and bookseller about forty years ago, and he having watched the progress of the town from the earliest times, wrote with the authority of knowledge upon all local topics.
