MR. GEORGE WHEELER.

We regret to record the death of Mr **George WHEELER**, of Alfred Street, Ryde, which took place suddenly on Friday.

Mr. WHEELER was in partnership with his brother, Mr. John WHEELER, in their fish business in High Street, Ryde. A member of the Foresters, and a prominent worker in the Congregational Church. Mr. WHEELER was respected by all, and his death is a loss to the town in which he spent his life. He is survived by a widow.

The funeral took place on Monday, at the Ryde Congregational Church, the Rev. W.R. LLOYD officiating. The chief mourners were Mr. James WHEELER and Mr. John WHEELER (brothers), Mr. S. ORCHARD and Mr. R. ORCHARD (brothers-in-law), Mr. G. WHEELER, Mr. E. WHEELER, Mr. R. WHEELER (nephews). The widow was too ill to attend.

FISHERMAN'S SUDDEN DEATH.

We regret to record the death of Mr **George WHEELER**, of Oxford Cottage, Arthur-street, which occurred with painful suddenness on Friday week. He was taken ill in Mr. T. CARTER's shop in High-street during the afternoon, conveyed home, and passed away within a few hours. He was a popular figure in the town.

A member of an old Island fishing family, he was the third son of the late Mr. Henry WHEELER and was born at Ryde 71 years ago. He was a member of the Foresters and was a Conservative in politics. He had lived in Arthur-street longer than any other resident there. He leaves a widow and a brother is Mr. John WHEELER, of High-street. The funeral took place on Monday, conducted at the Cemetery by the Rev.W.R.LLOYD. The mourners were Messrs. James and John WHEELER (brothers), S. ORCHARD (brother-in-law), S. ORCHARD, G.,E., and R, WHEELER (nephews). The widow was prevented by indisposition from attending and Messrs. J. and F. (nephews), were unable to be present. There were 31 choice floral wreaths.
