RYDE AIRMAN'S TRAGIC DEATH.

Particularly sad circumstances attended the death on Thursday week of Aircraftman Jack FOOTER, R.A.F., third son of Mr. and Mrs. B.R. FOOTER, of 34 Argyll-street, Ryde, Deceased, who was stationed at Gloucester, left his camp to post a letter to his wife saying he was coming home on leave. Next morning his body was found in the road by a bus conductress. At the inquest on Saturday it was stated that death was probably instantaneous and was due to heart failure following internal complications, and a verdict was returned accordingly. Aircraftman FOOTER, who was 22, attended the Ryde Central School, and since he was 14 had been employed as a clerk and agent by the Royal London Mutual Assurance Society. He joined the R.A.F. in 1940. He was a sidesman at Holy Trinity Church and A.S.M of the Scout troop, and very popular. His wife whom he married in 1940, was Miss Betty SMITH, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. SMITH, of Monkton-street. With her and his parents the greatest sympathy is felt. The Rev. L.N. St. ALPHONSE conducted a requiem Mass at Holy Trinity Church on Tuesday and officiated the funeral, assisted by the Rev. S.J. CORNISH, Members of Holy Trinity Scouts acted as acolytes.
