Mrs. ALLEN was devoted to the town in which she was born and lived all her life, and took great pride in its character and beauty.

The funeral was at the Parish Church on Wednesday, the Rev. Sherley PRICE officiating. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. A.J. TYDEMAN (son-in-law and daughter), Mr. W.P. ALLEN (brother) and Mrs. STONE (niece). Among others present were: Sir Henry SWEETMAN, J.P., and Mr. J.H. and Miss DOWN. The interment was at the Cemetery and a number of floral tributes were placed around the grave.
