DEATH OF MR. J. W. ATTRILL

The death occurred on Sunday of Mr. **James Wilfred ATTRILL**, of Kosikot, Ratcliffeavenue, aged 54. "Jimmy" ATTRIL, as he was known to all his friends, was a son of the late Capt. and Mrs. W. J. ATTRILL, of Binstead, and during the 1914-18 war he served at the general headquarters in Egypt as a pay-sergeant. For 20 years he was manager for a multiple firm of grocers at Newport and later at Ryde, and during the last war he was a member of the fire service staff of Saunders-Roe, of East Cowes. Of a particularly cheerful and kindly nature he made a host of friends who join in expressing sympathy with his widow.

The funeral service took place on Thursday, the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church, Binstead, where he had been a chorister since boyhood. The Rector (the Rev. C. HEALD) officiated and as the coffin was carried into the church the choir, accompanied at the organ by Mrs. HEALD, sang "Thy way, not mine, O Lord." Later they chanted the 23rd Psalm and sang "Thine for ever" and "Savior again to Thy dear name." As the cortege left the church the Nunc Dimittis was chanted.

The mourners were Mrs. ATTRILL (widow), Mrs. STAGG (sister), Messrs. Charles and Harry ATTRILL (brothers), Mr. and Mrs. V. BARNARD, Mr. and Mrs. L. J. FORSEY and Mr. and Mrs/ F. L. FORSEY (brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law), Mr. R. FORSEY and Mrs. K. JOHNCOX. Many friends also attended.

The interment was at the Binstead Cemetery and the grave was lined with flowers. Mr. E. VENUS was the undertaker.
