DEATH OF MR. A. F. AUSTIN

A very well known resident in the person of Mr. **Arthur Frank AUSTIN**, of 48 George-Street, passed away on Friday week at the age of 70. For 47 years Mr. AUSTIN was employed by Messrs. CHAPLIN and his courtesy and business efficiency won him an excellent reputation. He retired on pension in 1928. During his last illness he was devotedly nursed by his wife and daughter with whom deep sympathy has been shown.

The funeral was on Tuesday, a service being held in the Parish Church. The Vicar (Canon MOXON), officiated, and the mourners were Messrs. H. AUSTIN (cousin), L. TURTLE (nephew), Mr. and Mrs. A.E. AUSTIN (cousins), and R. COOPER (brother-in-law). The widow and daughter were unable to attend.

Among former colleagues and business friends attending were Messrs. E. WILTSHIRE, and S. HOGG, G.J. EVANS, (Messrs. CHAPLIN'S). J.H. GRIFFIN and F.W. DOWDALL (Messrs. PICKFORD'S) Launder (Messrs. SHEPARD Bros.), E. KING (Messrs. CHAPLIN'S), Portsmouth office, and three retired managers (Messrs. MERWOOD, EXTON, and BOURNE).

The large collection of flowers included tributes from colleagues of Messrs. CHAPLIN'S Ryde and Portsmouth offices, Mr. W.H. CHAPLIN (London general manager), and friends of the London office and old associates of Messrs. CROUCHER'S Messrs. PICKFORD'S, and Messrs. SHEPARD'S.
