DEATH OF MRS J. AUSTIN

The funeral took place yesterday (Friday), the first part of the service at Holy Trinity Church, of Mrs **Emma AUSTIN**, widow of Mr John AUSTIN, a former well-known licenced victualler, who was for some years connected with The Rajah Brook, Monkton-street, and previously with The Back Horse, Castle-street. Widespread regret is felt at the death of Mrs AUSTIN which occurred at Borneo, Simeon-street, on Tuesday morning at the age of 71.
