FUNERAL OF MR. A. J. AYLES

The funeral of Mr. **Arthur John AYLES**, 2 Cross Street, whose sudden death on the Eastern Esplanade we reported last week, took place at the Cemetery on Friday, which was preceded by a service at All Saints' at which the Rev. A. TOMPSETT officiated, and where a number of friends attended, thus showing their sympathy at the sad event. Mr. AYLES, who was 54 years of age, was well-known and respected in the town where he had spent all his life. At the age of 13 he was engaged in the greengrocery business with Mr. HARMSWORTH, who kept a shop just below deceased's present premises. Some time later he managed the business for Mr. HARMSWORTH's widow and 26 years ago he started to carry it on himself. His passing occurred within a day or two of the eleventh anniversary of the death of his eldest son. He was a popular member of the Trinity Club.
