

## ANGENARD

Information provided to RSHG by Peter Attrill  
Angenard (mother & daughter)

Eliza Amelia Wallis was baptised 19 Sep 1813 at Brading the daughter of Jeremiah and Charlotte Wallis.

She married 16 Aug 1842 at Bembridge to Armand Honore Angenard, a French citizen, father given as Charles.

Agnes Amelia Honorine Angenard was born 9 June 1845 in Paris, France.

It must be assumed that in 1851 the family were abroad (probably in France) as I've not found them in the census.

In 1861 Eliza, now described as a widow, a milliner aged 39 and her daughter Agnes, a music teacher aged 15, were living at 79 Union Street, Ryde.

In 1871 Eliza, still a milliner, is living at Villa L'Eysee in Monckton Street Ryde. Agnes is at The Terrace, Freshwater Bay Road, Freshwater shown as a governess in the household of Horatio Tennyson.

In 1881 Eliza (now D'Angenard) is still living at L'Eysee, Monckton Street but no occupation is given. Agnes is working as a governess in the household of the Bromley family at 1 Lansfield Terrace in Lambeth, London

In 1891 Eliza's address is now shown as 103 Monckton Street, a lodging house keeper. Agnes is a governess in the Nelles household at 22/24 Granada Road, Portsea.

Eliza died 1st qtr 1892 and (as you know) was buried in Ryde New Cemetery.

By 1901 Agnes is living at 103 Monckton Street, now described as a retired governess.

In 1911 Agnes is described as teaching languages and music at home, still 103 Monckton Street.

Agnes died 30 Nov 1935 and was buried 3 Dec 1935 in the Bembridge Churchyard Extension.

I can see no evidence that Eliza and Armand had any other children, but of course records for the period in France (between 1842? and 1861?) are not available on-line.
