**Former Hurdle Maker's Death**.---Another link with the old Island craft of hurdle-making was severed by the death at St. Mary's Hospital, Newport, on Tuesday, after a short illness, of Mr. **Percy Charles BARTON**, aged 76, of Rose Cottage, Marlborough-road. He had been engaged in the forestry business at Havenstreet all his working life, succeeding his father, Mr. Charles BARTON, upon his retirement. His father, died at Havenstreet a few years ago at the age of 94. When Mr. Percy BARTON retired a few years ago he was almost the last of the Island hurdle-makers, and he made a documentary film of his work for the rural crafts and industries archives at the County Hall. During the 1914-1918 war he served with the I.W. Rifles, and he was a member of Civil Defence in the last war. He was a committee member of the St. John's branch of the Conservative Association. He leaves a widow, and three sons and five daughters by a previous marriage. Cremation took place yesterday.
