THE LATE MRS BEAZLEY- The funeral took place at St. John's Cemetery on Saturday of Mrs Ada BEAZLEY wife of Mr Herbert BEAZLEY, who resided at Preston Villa, High Park and who died on Feb. 28th, aged 51. She leaves four children two boys and two girls with whom and her husband, the utmost sympathy has been expressed. Mrs BEAZLEY was secretary for St. John's Women's Institute for some years in their earlier days when she was associated with Mrs Frank POTT as president. After a brief respite from a severe illness of five weeks duration she contracted bronchial influenza from which she died and her loss is deeply deplored. The service was conducted at St. John's Church by the Vicar (Rev. J. GILLSON GILL). The chief mourners were Mr BEAZLEY (husband), and his sons Jim and Jack, Messrs. F. and A. BRADING (brothers), and amongst others present were Mr W. JACKSON and Mr Arnold LOWE. The floral tributes numbered nearly 30.
