OBITUARY
MRS. E. M. BIGGS

The death occurred on Sunday at her home, Winton Villa, Monkton Street, Ryde, of Mrs. **Edith Maud BIGGS**, aged 69, the widow of Mr. Arthur Percival BIGGS, the former Island

sportsman and athlete. who died last year.

The mother of 10 children, six of whom survive her, Mrs. BIGGS was a native of the town and had lived all her life in the Island. Her health began to deteriorate on the death of her husband, and she had been ill for the past three or four months. Until then she had taken a prominent share in the activities of Ryde Carnival Association, of which she was one of the earliest members, and, was also a vice-president of Ryde Harriers. Her youngest son was killed in Italy while serving with the Royal Hampshire Regiment in the last war. her two surviving sons are well-known Ryde athletes.

The funeral took place yesterday, the coffin having rested in St. Mary's R.C. Church the previous night. A Requiem Mass was followed by interment at Binstead Cemetery, the Revs. J. TROY and D. MCDERMOTT ROE officiating. Family mourners were Mr. and Mrs. A. P. BIGGS and Mr. and Mrs. A. G. BIGGS (sons and daughters-in-law), Mrs. J. MASON and the Misses E. M., and D. BIGGS (daughters), and Mr. H. READING. Representing the I.W. Cross Country Association were Ald. Lt. Col. C. L. ELLERY, O.B.E. (president) and Mr. R. RAYNER; Ryde Carnival Association, Mr. F. HELLYER (sec.) and Mr. R. PAWLING.
