We regret to have to record the death of Mr. A. J. BIRD, optician and photographer, of Union-street, which took place on Tuesday morning at the Royal I.W. County Hospital from extreme weakness following a successful operation. The deceased who had been in business in the town for 28 years, was well known for his smart business ability.
