We regret to record the death of Mrs. **Louisa Harriett BISHOP**, which took place at her residence, Gordon House, Millward-Road on Thursday. She was 70 and had been living at Ventnor where she interested herself in the Town Mission and the Methodist cause. Her husband predeceased her last August. A son, the Rev. Frederick BISHOP is a Congregational Minister in the United States.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Monday afternoon, the Revs. G.A. HILLYAR-RUSS (Garfield-Road Methodist) and A. TRIGGS officiating, assisted by Mr. J. BARBER (Ventnor Town Missioner). The latter in the course of an address, spoke very feelingly of the deceased's connection with the Mission and church work in Ventnor.
