## Sudden Death of Well Known Ashey Farmer

The death occurred on Sunday, under painful circumstances, of Mr. Leonard William BROWN, of West Ashey Farm, a well known and much esteemed agriculturist. The deceased, who lived with his invalid sister, was apparently in his usual good health and had had his customary mid-day meal, but shortly afterwards Miss SMALL, a neighbour and housekeeper, found him dead in the lavatory. The deceased, who was 68, and had farmed at Upper Appleford and Westside, Chale, before coming to West Ashey 28 years ago, was a familiar figure at Newport Market, a valued member of the committee of the I.W. Guernsey Cattle Society, and a successful breeder of Guernseys for the commercial market.

The funeral took place at Ashey Church on Wednesday, when the Rev. Neville MARTIN (Vicar of Ryde) officiated. Miss NUTT played the organ and the hymns sung were "Lead kindly light" and "Now the labourer's task is o'er."
