**Obituary.**- The death took place at The County Hospital on Sunday of Miss Lucy Margaret BROWN, of Dixholme, Corbett-road, in her 77th year. By her passing the parish of St. Michael loses a greatly respected parishioner, one who engaged devotedly in the work of St. Michael's Church. At one time with her friend Miss A. A. M. NEWSTEAD she was secretary of the branch of the Church Union and had been the collector for the Red Cross Penny-a-Week fund. A daughter of the late Mr. Isaac BAKER-BROWN, F.R.C.S., she trained at St. Thomas's Hospital, London, and qualified as a Queen's nurse. After periods of nursing in London and at Kettering she worked for many years at the Scott-Gatty Memorial Home, Ecclesfield, near Sheffield with her friend until both retired and came to live in Ryde in the autumn of 1926.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held at St. Michael's Church, conducted by the Rev. L. C. BROOKSMITH. The mourners were the Misses BROWN (three sisters) and Major STOUGHTON-HARRIS. Among others present were the Rev. C. HEALD (representing the Church Union), Mr. G. RICHARDS (churchwarden), the Misses FISHER, Mrs. DENHAM, Mrs. . WHITE, Mrs. A. SMITH, Mrs. KEMP, Mrs. G WILLIAMS, Miss PLUMBLEY, Mrs. WILLIAMS, Mrs. BUTT, Miss NUTT, Miss STENNING, and Miss PENDERGAST. The interment was in the Cemetery and there were a number of floral tributes.
