HAYLANDS RESIDENT'S DEATH

The death occurred on Wednesday the 7th, at 5 Butt's-Road, Haylands, of Mrs. **Eliza BRUNDISH**, wife of Mr. Robert BRUNDISH late of the Trinity Service, at the age of 69. Mrs. BRUNDISH came to the Island from Great Yarmouth sixteen years ago, and had won the respect of her fellow villagers. She was a regular attendant at St. Michael's Swanmore, being taken there in a bath chair during the last few weeks. She had been ailing for some time, but had a stroke about a fortnight ago. She leaves a husband, three sons and five daughters to mourn her loss with whom much sympathy has been expressed, and who desire to thank all who have made kind inquires.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon, the first part of the service being held at St. Michael's Church, the Vicar (the Rev. A.C. DURHAM) officiating. A beautiful cross, subscribed for by the members of the Mothers' Union and the Mothers' Meeting connected with that church, and an expression of sympathy and appreciation of the deceased lady's services, signed by Mrs. BLACKETT (president) and all the members, was received by the family. A hymn, "Just as I am," was sung, Mr. HAIR presiding at the organ.

The interment was at Ashley Cemetery, and mourners being Mr. BRUNDISH (husband), Mr. Robert BRUNDISH (son), Mesdames SHELTON F. and E. HOMES and Miss Louise BRUNDISH (grand daughter), Mr. W. LAMBERT and Mrs. SAUNDERS (Cowes), Mrs. LLOYD and Mrs. CARTER.
