THE LATE CAPT. BURT, R.N. FUNERAL AT ST. JOHN'S CEMETERY.

The esteem in which the late Capt. Edmund W. BURT, R.N. of "Fairfield," was held, more especially amongst the residents of St. John's including church workers and those connected with the Lifeboat Institution and Missions to Seamen, was evident at the funeral on Wednesday in last week when a service was held at the church prior to the interment in St. John's Cemetery.

The choir chanted the "Nunc Dimittis" and as the cortege left the church, the organist (Mr. R.S. TOOGOOD) played Chopin's "Funeral March."
