Death of Mr. J. A. K. BUSH.- A member of a very old Ryde family, Mr. John Arthur Kingsworth BUSH, died at his residence, Jersey Villa, Argyll-street, on Sunday, aged 66. Early in his life Mr. BUSH joined the firm of Messrs. A. W. TAYLOR and Company, auctioneers and estate agents, of Putney, in whose service he remained until retirement four years ago, when he returned to his native town, where he had always spent his holidays.

The funeral was on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held in the Garfield-road Methodist Church. The Rev. H. MAC ROW officiated and the hymn "Abide with me" was sung. The mourners were Mr. Arthur J. NEWBERY, Mr. A. L. NIGHTINGALE (representing Messrs. TAYLOR and Co., Putney), Major R. K. T. NIGHTINGALE, and Capt. G. BAKER (representing Messrs. FRANK TAYLOR and NIGHTINGALE), Messrs. E. FIELDER, E. CRABB, R. GROSE, and V. WINKLES. Others present were Lieut.-Col. C. L. ELLERY, Major KEEGAN, Messrs. A. L. BROWNE (National Provincial Bank), T. S. MELLANBY, J. H. DOWN, C. MERRILL, T.C., A. C. LOCKE, E. F. BROWN, and A. F. HANSON. There were wreaths from his old firm, his old colleagues at High-street, Putney, and the Conservative Club, of which he was a member.
