**Elderly Lady's Death after a Fall.**---The Coroner (Mr. R. E. A. WEBSTER) held an inquest at 9 Belvedere-street on Monday on Mrs. Alice Jane BUTT, aged 80, who died on Saturday after a fall the previous day. Samuel Henry Wellesley BUTT, a chartered accountant, said his mother had been living with his wife and himself for 14 months and during that time had been in excellent health. At about 8 p.m. on Friday week he returned home and found his wife telephoning for the doctor. Over-hearing his wife's conversation, he went upstairs, where he found his mother lying on the floor. She could not move and complained of pains in her hip and thigh. With the assistance of the doctor he put her to bed and when he saw her later she was quite comfortable. He heard he sleeping heavily and when his wife went to see her in the morning she was dead. His wife, who had influenza and was not therefore called as a witness, told him that his mother came in to see her, and, turning round to call the cat, slipped off the bed on to the floor. Dr. T. HAMBLY said that Mrs. BUTT fractured a femur. She was suffering from blood pressure and myocarditis and this, aggravated by the fracture and consequent shock, was the cause of death. The Coroner recorded a verdict of death from natural causes.
