**SUDDEN DEATH.-** A death of a very sudden character took place in Argyll-street on Tuesday evening. Mr. **Frederick Lewis James BUXEY**, a young man in his 27th year, arrived in the town on Saturday on a visit to his friends. On Tuesday, accompanied by his two sisters, he visited Southsea, but while there he complained of not being very well. The party returned to Ryde by the last boat, the deceased being apparently in his usual health. He had some biscuits for supper on reaching home, and as he felt chilly he was given some whiskey. He had no sooner drank this than he fell on his sister's shoulder and died without a murmur. Mr. K. W. INGLEBY-MACKENZIE was sent for and pronounced life extinct. Deceased's father and mother both died from heart disease, and no doubt this was the cause of their son's death. An inquest was not considered necessary.
