Death of Miss CAREY.- We regret to announce the death of Miss Nora Madeline Alice CAREY. The deceased lady had been in failing health for over two years and passed away on Wednesday at Carringtons, High Park-road. She was the elder daughter of the late Col. C. de B. CAREY, R.E. (retd.), and a member of an old Guernsey family. Her father was at one time in charge of the Royal Engineers in the Island, and the family is widely known and respected. Miss CAREY had identified herself with several charitable causes. During the war she was a member of the V.A.D. and for four years worked at Hazelwood, then a Red Cross hospital. She will chiefly be remembered for her work for the N.S.P.C.C. and her affection for little children was no doubt responsible for the large amount of time and kindly interest she took in society. She became a collector and a member of the Administrative Committee in 1907. For many years she was secretary of the local Ladies' Committee, which she assisted to form in 1912, and was Hon. treasurer of the Island branch from 1913. By untiring work she did much to increase interest in the society, which undoubtedly owes a great debt to her for the prominent position it holds in the Island to-day. She held the society's certificate of merit in recognition of her valuable work. owing to ill-health she reluctantly had to give up public work a few months ago, when Mr. H. C. FOWLER succeeded her as hon. treasurer. She was a member of the women Legionists and had served on the committee of the local Missions to Seamen. Some years ago she took an active part in the affairs of Holy Trinity Church. A lady of much personal charm and kindness, her passing is deeply deplored. The sincerest sympathy is felt with her aged mother and sister in their irreparable loss.

The funeral takes place to-day (Saturday) at 2.30 p.m. at St. John's Church.
