DEATH OF MR. EDWARD CARTER, J.P.

Senior County Magistrate. Funeral Service

It was with deep regret that we announce the death of Mr. **Edward CARTER**, J.P., which took place at his residence, East Upton, late on Wednesday. He had reached the age of 82 years.

Mr. CARTER was born on September 20th, 1848, in the parish of St. George's Hanover-square, London. He was of an Island family, and his parents came to reside in the Island when he was ten years old. He was educated at Wellington and Trinity College, Cambridge, and was later called to the bar. He never practiced, however, but took up agricultural pursuits, being a noted breeder of Jersey cattle, with which he won many cups at some of the principal mainland shows. A typical country gentleman, he was keenly interested in outdoor sports, and was one of the oldest members of the Royal Yacht Club. He was chairman of the Haylands, Ashey, and Swanmore Horticultural Society, and a member of the Royal Isle of Wight Agricultural Society.

Mr. CARTER was the principal landowner in the district, was the senior magistrate on the Isle of Wight County Bench, and was in 1906-7 High Sheriff for the County of Southampton. It is interesting to note that while he occupied this position arrangements were being made to make a wedding present to Princess Victoria of Battenberg on the occasion of her marriage to the King of Spain, and a reference to this connection is made in our "25 years ago" feature on the front page. He was a member of the Election Committee and a Life Governor of the County Hospital, and his charity to that and other deserving causes was as great as it was unostentatious.

For many years he was a member of the Standing Joint Committee and was Senior Commissioner of Taxes.

Many years ago Mr. CARTER was co-opted chairman of the Newchurch Parish Council without facing an election. He was keenly devoted to the Conservative cause, and was president of the Haylands branch. Mr. CARTER's death was due to a poisoned hand which he sustained about a fortnight ago, the poison spreading through his system and affecting his heart. He leaves a widow and five daughters.

THE FUNERAL

The mortal remains of Mr. Edward CARTER were laid to rest at Ryde Cemetery on Monday in the presence of a large gathering who testified to the esteem in which the deceased was held. The service was conducted in the chapel by the Rev. F.J. BAMFORD (Vicar of Newchurch), who was assisted by the Rev. Canon G.A. JOHNSTONE (Vicar of Ryde). The interment was in the family vault.

The family mourners were Mrs. CARTER (widow), the Misses Mary Dorothy Gertrude, and Kathleen CARTER, Miss SMITH (niece), the Rev. Richard SMITH (nephew), Sir Hugh MURRAY, Col. A.H.
