FUNERAL OF MR. H. T. W. CHENNELL

The funeral of Mr. Henry Thomas William CHENNELL, A.R.C.O., late organist of St. James's Church, took place on Saturday, Mr. CHENNELL, whose death occurred somewhat suddenly at his home, Malvern, John-Street, on the previous Tuesday, was 77 years of age. He studied under the late Dr. MINTER, of Westminster Abbey, Dr. Haydn KEETON, at Peterborough Cathedral, and Dr. BREWER at Gloucester Cathedral. For nearly four years he was organist at Brantboughton, Lincs, and was for some 32 years a school master at Speldhurst, Kent, and organist at the church there. He was a bronze medallist of the Society of Arts. On his retirement about 12 years ago he came to Ryde and was appointed organist at St. James's Church, a position he filled with great devotion until a few months ago.

The Rev. W.A. DOHERTY officiated at the service in St James's Church and deceased's favourite hymns, "On the Resurrection morning" and "There is a blessed home," were sung. The chief mourners were Mr. and Mrs. J.H. GREENFIELD, of Carisbrooke (brother-in-law and sister), and Mr. P. GREENFIELD of London (nephew).

Among others present were Messrs. F. FOWLER (people's warden), J.H. DOWN, W.KERRIDGE, A.W. GALE, and C. CRABB (representing St. James's Men's Service Committee, of which deceased was formerly hon.
