OBITUARY

MR. A. C. CLARK

The death took place at Hove on Sunday, where he had lived in retirement since 1924, of Mr. Augustus Charles CLARK (65), one of Ryde's first motor-coach proprietors. A member of the Philharmonic and other societies, Mr. CLARK was extremely well-known in the town. His wife pre-deceased him in 1921.

The remains were brought to Ryde for burial. The first part of the service was held at Holy

Trinity Church, the mourners being Mr. John Bradley CLARK (son), Mr. William BRADLEY (uncle), Mr. Ian MARSHALL, Major D. C. G. SHARP, Miss WOODLAND, Mrs GALE, Miss K. CULLEN, Mr. EASTON, Mr. and Mrs. MORRIS and Miss MORRIS, of Ryde, and Mr. E. G. WELCH. The interment followed at the Cemetery, the Rev. L. A. D. WOODLAND, of London, a friend of the deceased's, being the officiating clergyman.
