Many Church Bequests in Island Will

Mrs Mary Winefride Isobel COLLYER, of Westwood Road, Ryde, who died on September 2, left £87,116 gross, £86,039 net.

She left £1,000 and her jewelery to St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Ryde, and a further £100 for Masses, £1,000 to Canon MURRAY and £100 to Father R Hendry, both of St. Mary's Catholic Church. £1,000 to Portsmouth Roman Catholic Diocese Education of Priests Fund, £200 to the Servite Homes, £100 each to the parochial church council of All Saints, Ryde, Royal Masonic Hospital, Far East Missionary Society, Salvation Army, Eventide Homes and the Cheshire Home, Appley Cliff, Popham Road, Shanklin, and her nursing certificates and four nursing medals to the General Nursing Council of England and Wales.

She also left £100 to each priest saying her Requiem Mass, some effects and a few personal legacies totalling £2,600, and £3,000 to her husband and her home and effects there not bequeathed upon for him for life and then from the sale proceeds of same further personal legacies totalling £2,600, £1,000 and £250 each to the Cheshire Home, Shanklin, the Salvation Army, Eventide Homes, the Abbeyfield Ryde Society, the Guild of Past Patients of the Royal IW County Hospital, Ryde, and £200 to the parochial church council of All Saints, Ryde.

The remainder of her property is left to the Roman Catholic Bishop of Portsmouth to benefit St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Ryde.

NB: We have noted the discrepancies in the spelling of her 2nd name in the various records, it is written here as we found it.
