DEATH OF MR COLVERSON.- We regret to announce the death of Mr F. COLVERSON, which took place at his residence, 155, High Street, on the 2nd inst. As a tradesman of excellent standing in the town, he was esteemed for his energy and thoroughness, which characteristics, combined with uniform courtesy, won for him an influential connection which steadily increased. His success in extending his circle of friends was no doubt due to his genial and pleasant disposition.

The funeral took place on Thursday amidst many demonstrations of respect, blinds being drawn and shutters up along the route. The coffin was of polished elm with brass fittings, and had the following inscription: "Francis COLVERSON, born 21st June, 1859, died 2nd December, 1899.
