DEATH OF A VERY OLD INHABITANT.--- We have to record the death of Mr. **Isaac COOPER**, who we believe was the veritable "eldest inhabitant," Born at Freshwater, on December 6th, 1791, Mr. COOPER, had he lived till Sunday next, would have entered on his 95th year. It is said to be over 70 years ago since the venerable old gentleman came to Ryde with a basket of tools on his back, and commenced as a blacksmith. He had during that lengthy period seen the gradual growth of a little village into a large town, and would detail, to any one who would talk to him, the successive stages in the development of the town, his memory for persons and dates being exceedingly good. Rather more than 50 years ago, Mr. COOPER built Sea View Cottage, Doverstreet; there he lived for more than half a century, and there he died on Monday evening, surrounded by his descendants, who are numerous. He retained his full faculties up to the very last, reciting, only a day or so before his death, a piece of poetry which he had learned some 80 years before.
