War Veteran's Death. – The funeral took place on Wednesday of Mr. Joseph Edwin CORNEY, aged 77, of 33 Castle Street, who died at his home on Wednesday week. He was a stoker in the Royal navy for 38 years, including active service throughout the 1914-18 and last wars. The Rev. G. W. RUMBLE officiated at the service at All Saints' Church. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack. The hymn "There is a green hill" was sung, and Mr. W. L. REED (organist) played "Eternal Father" as the cortege left the church.
