## **DEATH OF MISS BERTHA DASHWOOD**

We much regret to record the death of Miss **Bertha DASHWOOD**, daughter of the late Mr Sidney DASHWOOD (who pre deceased her just twelve months ago), which occurred at her residence, Tyne House Monkton street, after an illness of only three weeks. The deceased lady who was 56 years of age, belonged to a well-known and esteemed Ryde family and was of a most amiable and cheerful disposition. She appears to have contracted a chill on the liver which developed into a more serious complaint, and she was unable to take any food, her death being due to exhaustion and cardiac failure. Miss DASHWOOD was well known in musical circles, having for a considerable time acted as hon sec. of the Ryde Centre of the Trinity College of Music London, the duties of which important position she carried out with much ability. She had just prior to her fatal illness, been making the arrangements for the annual distribution of prizes at the Town hall, which has been postponed. In that

capacity she will be greatly missed. She leaves a married sister, a brother (who is in New Zealand) and an aunt Miss DASHWOOD of Grove Cottage, Dover street.

The funeral took place on Thursday at the Cemetery, prior to which a service was held at Holy Trinity Church, at which the Vicar (Rev. Noel STUBES, M.A.) officiated The mourners comprised Mr and Mrs WADDINGTON (sister and brother in law) of Southall, Middlesex, Miss DASHWOOD (aunt). Mr Douglas MARVIN (uncle) of Ventnor, and Guy WADDINGTON (nephew), also Nurse RIDDETT. A number of friends assembled in the Church as a token of respect. The boys' choir attended and led the singing of one of the deceased's favourite hymns, "Jesus Lives" and at the conclusion of the service the choir preceded the coffin to the church porch chanting the "Nunc Dimittus". Mr A Percy JAMES presided at the organ and played appropriate music. There was a number of floral tokens from the relatives and friends.

The funeral arrangements were entrusted to Mr Chas. LANGDON.
