HEAD OF FIRM DIES AT 71

The funeral took place at Holy Trinity Church, Ryde, of the head of the haulage and removal firm of E. DIBBENS and Sons Ltd, Mr. Harold Percy DIBBENS, 71. A large congregation attended the service on Wednesday of Mr. DIBBENS of 93 Monkton-Street, Ryde, who died at the Royal I.W. County Hospital, Ryde.

Born in Ryde, Mr. DIBBENS was a member of the East Medina and Vectensian Lodges and the Vectensian Chapter of Freemasons who were all represented at the service. He leaves a widow, three sons and a daughter. Canon R.G.C. CORBET-MILWARD conducted the service which was followed by interment at Ryde Cemetery.
