Death of Mrs. DICKERSON.--The death took place at the County Hospital, on Friday, of Mrs. Daisy Grace DICKERSON, widow of Mr. J. H. DICKERSON, of 12 Colenutt's-road, Haylands. Deceased, who was 60 years of age, died rather suddenly the day before she was to have been discharged from hospital. By her death St. James's Church has lost one of its most devoted workers. She was a great helper at all church bazaars. She was formerly actively associated with the Ashe and Haylands Horticultural Society. She was president of the Co-operative Women's Guild, and a member of the women's section of the local Labour Party. Sympathy is felt with her son and daughter.

The funeral was on Tuesday, the first part of the service being conducted in St. James's Church by the Rev. E. E. M. GREEN. "Abide with me" was sung and as the remains were borne from the church the organist played Purcell's Trumpet voluntary, one of the deceased's favourite compositions. The mourners were Miss DICKERSON (daughter), Engine-room Artificer R. C. DICKERSON (son), Mr. G. REED (brother), Mrs. LANDS (sister), Mrs. C. W. DICKERSON (sister-in-law), Mr. C. WHITFIELD (brother-in-law), Mrs. WILLOUGHBY, Mrs. WHITFIELD, and Mrs. WOODS (nieces), Mr. E. P. TOPP, Miss and Miss E. EDWARDS, Mrs. GREENHALGHS, Mrs. LACEY, Mr. and Mrs. S. WELLS, Mr. and Mrs. PINK, Mr. and Mrs. SCRIVENER, and Mr. H. RANDELL. The Co-operative Women's Guild was fully represented, Mr. A. J. BRAZIER, J.P. represented the Island Labour Party, Mr. T. HODGES and Miss MOREY the Haylands Horticultural Society, and Mr. P. F. LORD the County Hospital Contributory Scheme. There were over 40 floral tributes, including those from the St. James's Church Working and Knitting Parties; the Co-operative Women's Guild; the Labour Party; the women's section of the Labour Party; the Haylands Horticultural Society; and patients of the Calthorpe ward in the County Hospital.
