**DEATH OF THE DOWAGER LADY DICKSON.-** This venerable lady expired at her residence, St. Thomas's House, Ryde, on Tuesday last. She was Harriet, daughter of Admiral BOURMASTER, of Titchfield, Hants, and was married on the 17th of August, 1797, to Sir Archibald Collingwood DICKSON, the second baronet, of Hordingham, in the county of Norfolk, who was rear admiral of the Red, and died on the 18th June, 1827. There was a large issue from this marriage: William, the present baronet; Archibald, who died in India in 1834; John Collingwood, who died young; Colpoys, who married Emma, daughter of William KNYVETT, esq.; Alexander Collingwood, who married Miss WHIMPER; John Bourmaster, who married Miss POYNDER; George Collingwood, who died in 1853, leaving a widow and two daughters; Francis Collingwood, also married; Harriet Jane, married to Admiral Thomas Wren CARTER; Mary-Magdalen, married to Col. DOUGLAS, and died in 1847; and Augusta Caroline, who died in 1833. In addition to these families, Mr. and Mrs. W. E. RATCLIFFE will be put into mourning. The remains of the deceased lady will be interred in the Ryde burial ground on Saturday. This venerable lady's decease was quite sudden and unexpected, as she dined on Christmas Day, in her usual good health and spirits, with Miss PLAYER at Ryde House, with whom she was particularly friendly. She passed the good old age of 82 years.
