

OBITUARY MRS. B. DIMMER.

Many Ryde and Island people will regret to learn of the death of Mrs. **Bessie Florence DIMMER**, which occurred on Friday morning. Mrs. DIMMER, who was in her sixtieth year, was the wife of Mr. John James DIMMER, of 135 High-Street, printer and stationer, and was the sister of Mr. G.H.V. BONNER, who is another well-known member of the community.

Mrs. DIMMER'S death follows a serious operation which she underwent about 18 months ago. Her death occurred at 44 St. John's-Road. She leaves two daughters. She was a great social and church worker, and was also a member of the Holy Trinity Mothers' Union.

The funeral took place at Holy Trinity on Tuesday, when the service was taken by the Vicar, the Rev. L. Noel St. ALPHONSE, and the Vicar of Ryde, the Rev. W.N.
