A Former Verger's Death. - The death occurred at St. Mary's Hospital on Tuesday of Mr. Frederick Clarence DONNO, aged 64, of Evelyn, Marlborough Road, who for several years was verger of St. John's Church, Oakfield during the vicariate of the Rev. E. T. H. ROYDS. He was a native of London, and served in the Royal Navy for 30 years, attaining the rank of chief yeoman of signals. He retired in 1927 but was recalled on the outbreak of the second world war. He belonged to the Island branch of the Royal Naval Association. He leaves a widow and son.
